Some orchids bring to mind the color **red.** For example, there is an orchid named "Broughton sanguinea", which grows in the low-altitude rain forests of Jamaica. "Sanguinea" is Latin for "blood red", descriptive of the bright color of this orchid's flowers, which has contributed to its popularity, along with its ease of cultivation. B. sanguinea has been much used in hybridization, especially with Cattleyas, producing Cattleytonias.

B. sanguinea produces egg-shaped pseudobulbs in a compact cluster, along with two narrow dark-green rough-textured leaves. The flowers emerge from the tip of the pseudobulbs in winter, producing a flurry of flowers looking as a whole like a red chandelier. This orchid needs lots of light and humidity, along with subtropical temperatures no colder than you would want to swim in.

B. sanguinea likes to grow on a slab made of cork or in a pot filled with free-draining coarse bark. It needs water and fertilizer during its growing and flowering periods, but can be weaned off water during dormancy. In contrast, bulbophyllums, representing over 10% of all known orchid species and requiring similar growing conditions, should not be allowed to dry out completely during dormancy.

Two of the world's smallest orchids are "bulbophyllums": B. minutissimum and B. pygmaeum. These orchids are the size of a pinhead or smaller, and are best viewed with a hand lens. Easier to view are bulbophyllums like B. rothschildianum with its foot-long reddish inflorescence and B. macranthum with its fleshy-textured "wine red" flowers. B. macranthum grows in the tropical forests of Myanmar (a.k.a. Burma), while B. rothschildianum grows in northeastern India.

B. beccarii, named for Odoardo Beccari, has the largest reddish leaves of any known Asian orchid, with a smell akin to rotting elephant's flesh. It grows in the lowland rain forests of Malaysia and is generally associated with the resinous timber-yielding dipterocarp trees.

FROM ORANGE, ULSTER COUNTIES, NEWBURGH, KINGSTON:

go onto the Hotel ramp to the parking lot. exit: Exit 8 – Cross Westchester Expressway (Route 287 East). Take 287 East to first exit on your right – Exit 1. Take the fork on your right to Elmsford. At the end of the ramp, turn right on Route 119. Hotel is on your left. Go to the second light, make U turn and South on the NYS Thruway, to I-287 East (toward White Plains), go over the Tappan Zee Bridge. Continue on Thruway to second
